# Literacy



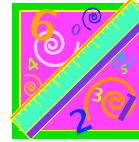
- Identifies upper and lower case letters
- Matches letters to sounds
- Blends sounds to make words (decodes)
- Uses reading strategies to understand literature
- Listens to, retells and understands texts
- Identifies beginning, middle and end of story
- Communicates through listening, speaking and writing
- Reads and writes high frequency words
- Expands vocabulary
- Responds to poems, rhymes, books and songs

# Technology

- Identifies parts of a computer
- Uses mouse and other components of a computer
- Creates by using graphics software (paint tools, stamps)
- Uses software such as Kid Pix



# Math



- Identifies numbers to 50
- Prints numeral 0-20
- Communicates math ideas
- Counts forward to 100 or beyond, and backward from 10
- Counts up to 20 objects and keeps track of quantities
- Sorts, classifies and compares objects by shape, size and color
- Creates, extends and records simple repeating patterns
- Shows understanding of and uses direction, location and position words
- Identifies basic 2-D shapes
- Explores 3-D shapes
- Uses a calendar to understand the concept of time
- Measures with objects
- Begins to use simple strategies to solve mathematical problems
- Solves problems in more than one-way

# Bible

- Understands that the Bible is the infallible Word of God
- Participates in activities to strengthen personal and social skills with classmates
- Participates in singing and dramatics of stories
- Learn to ask for and accept God's forgiveness
- Understands concept of being a servant
