Reading & Writing



- Applies reading strategies to decode and understand what is read and heard
- Uses literacy as a tool to think critically and communicate clearly using a variety of texts
- Develops word attack skills and increases vocabulary
- Recognizes high frequency words
- Uses writing to develop ideas (narrative, informational, poetry, etc.)
- Uses writing skills (punctuation, grammar, capitalization)
- Learns new words through instruction and independent reading
- Speaks clearly and communicates needs, feeling and ideas in complete sentences
- Reads for enjoyment and learning

Technology

- Is familiar with computer terminology
- Is able to insert clip art, drag and pull



Math

- Counts, compares and combines quantities
- Creates, explores and extends patterns
- Reads, writes, compares and uses numbers to 120
- Adds three one-digit numbers
- Sorts, classifies and compares objects based on their attributes
- Gathers, records and graphs data in real world problems
- Uses a calendar to identify date, day of the week, month, year, yesterday, today and tomorrow
- Creates and solves words problems
- Explores the concept of symmetry in real world situations

Social Studies

- Compares how families live today to families in earlier times
- Identifies individuals and groups who in the past and present
- Understands elements of living in a community
- Draws and uses map skills



Science
