Reading



- Applies reading strategies to decode and understand what is read and heard
- Uses literacy as a tool to think critically and communicate clearly using a variety of texts
- Develops word attack skills and increases vocabulary
- Recognizes high frequency words
- Uses writing to develop ideas (narrative, informational, poetry, etc.)
- Uses language skills (punctuation, grammar, capitalization and complete sentences)
- Uses reference materials to obtain information
- Learns new words through instruction and independent reading

Technology

- Familiar with computer terminology
- Able to open existing file
- Able to insert clip art, drag and pull
- Able to change font, size and style
- Able to indent and type



Math

- Able to add three one digit numbers
- Sorts, classifies and compares objects based on their attributes
- Gathers, records and graphs data in real world problems
- Explores the concept of symmetry in real world situations
- Estimates and measures length, time, money and temperature
- Combines pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters to equal one dollar
- Uses a calendar to identify date, day of the week, month, year, yesterday, today and tomorrow
- Creates and solves words problems
- Reads, writes, compares, counts and orders numbers
- Adds and subtracts one-digit, two-digit and three-digit numbers
- Adds and subtracts to 20

Bible

- Understand that the Bible is the infallible Word of God
- Develop love for God and Jesus and a caring concern for His creation
- Develop ability to praise and pray, love and obey

Science

- Develops an attitude of respect and understanding for God's wonderful creation.
- Uses the five senses to observe, communicate, organize and relate scientific information

Physical Education

- Develops locomotor (e.g. running, jumping, climbing, and non-locomotor e.g. stretching, balancing, bending) skills and applies them in a variety of activities

- Identifies individual and groups who have shaped the nation in the past and present
- Locates places using maps and globes
